Social Employers and EPSU, partners in EU-OSHA campaign “Healthy Workplaces – Lighten the load”

25.01.2021

Social services workers are at very high risk of suffering from work-related musculoskeletal disorders (MSDs). If not prevented, MSDs lead to a situation where workers are no longer able to carry out certain tasks or have to stop working in the sector altogether. It is crucial that employers' representatives and trade unions work together so that workplace risks potentially leading to MSDs are effectively assessed and tackled.

That is why the Federation of European Social Employers and the European Federation of Public Service Unions (EPSU) are joining the EU-OSHA ['Healthy Workplaces - Lighten the Load' campaign](#) as official partners.

The campaign will run over the course of 2021 and 2022. It seeks to create safer and healthier workplaces, by increasing awareness of work-related musculoskeletal disorders and promoting working together to ensure that effective preventive measures are taken to tackle MSDs. As social partners, we look forward to making the technical expertise of EU-OSHA available to our members and to share and develop good practices in conferences & workshops.
